Don’t do too much

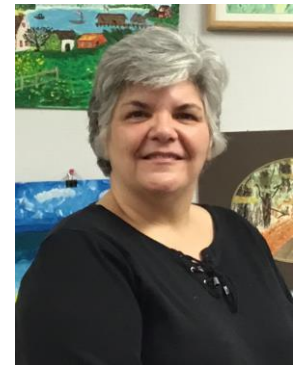

4. What do you like to do in your spare time?

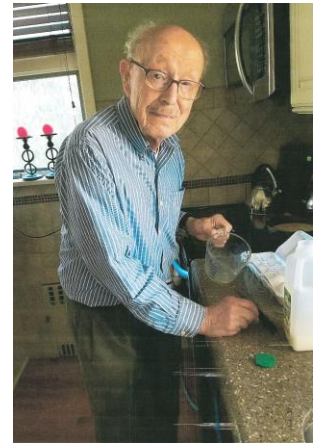
“I like to read, do jigsaw puzzles, exercise and go hiking with my husband.”

Hello. My name is Roy B.

I was born in England.

I was born 4th of July, 1939.

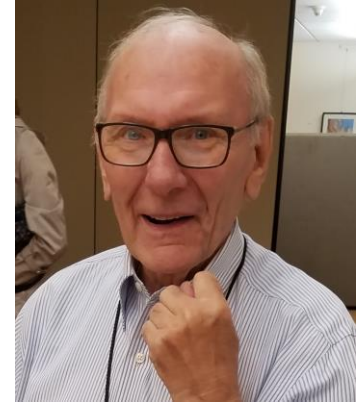
My mother died when I was 2 years old.

I moved from Southampton to Dibden Purlie in England to my Granny.

There was a school 20x30 one room the woman taught 6 years to 15 yrs.

One day I was climbing a tree and they called "Roy" and Granny said "This is your new Mom" and I went with them. This is your bedroom, your father will be happy. He was happy. I was confused.

I had to go to a new school.

One day at school the teacher had me go to the Headmaster's office. I met Mr. Peery.

"My job is to talk to you and offer you a job. The shipping federation, here is my card, I hope you take it."

Thank you, I must talk to my father about it. My father seemed pleased. I told them I would take it.

The job I had was running upstairs and down, making tea and running the carbon paper.

I was 17 years old and I told them, I wanted to get on a ship.

He said you have to be 18 years old and go to London. I said 17 is enough. I started as a salon boy in the 3rd restaurant.

These are some of the ships that I worked on: Edinburgh Castle, Athlone Castle, Cunard Steamship, Saxonia, Invernia, Caronia, Mauritania, Queen Mary, Furness Withy and the Queen of Bermuda.

It was July, I met my wife. She asked me to take her and her friends picture and I said, "I certainly can!"

I fell in love.

We were married for 53 years and we were happy. We were in Red Bank, N.J. We went to England for 3 or 4 years.

We traveled everywhere: all the states from Florida, Maine, Las Vegas and Arizona. We had 3 weeks in the Mediterranean and 2 weeks in Nassau.

Everything was fine. One day I took the dog out and my wife Terry told me she was going to take a bath. I took Piper out and she did her thing. I went to bed. I woke up and the bathroom door was closed.

She passed away – it was 2013

We did have a good life together 53 years.

My name is Edwin.

I entered the United States in 1976 from Grenada.

The natives speak a Patois, a broken French, but I spoke English.

I lived in Brooklyn with my aunt and uncle. My aunt invited me to come live with them because she didn't like my lifestyle in Grenada.

In Brooklyn, I worked at White Castle and went to tech school in Manhattan. After I was mugged in Brooklyn, I rented an apartment in Newark, working at Central Warehouse.

Then I moved to Irvington where I still live. I was working in the Business Office of the Irvington Board of Education when I had a stroke in June of 2016.

Beth Israel Hospital sent me to Kessler for therapy. They taught me to walk, exercise, and take care of myself. I had physical, occupational and speech therapy there. Kessler recommended I go to Adler as beneficial to me for spelling and writing. The speech therapist said it could help me use the computer.

Adler helps with memory, communication, and discussion about today's news. I enjoy discussions and knowledge about the brain and its operation. Each person helps teach more about it.

I enjoy listening to music and learning about the artists like Bon Jovi and protest music. I learn about dirty jobs like cleaning up after animals, sewer work, and garbage man.

I like to communicate through Skype and with the other members. Other people come to lecture about their travels. I'm learning a lot and becoming very knowledgeable at Adler. I'm learning about Aphasia.

People ask me what Adler is. I tell them about what happens with a stroke, how it affects the body and speech. I love learning. I love Adler for the teaching. I'm happy to come here for learning, communication and the people. I plan to continue to be a part of Adler.
